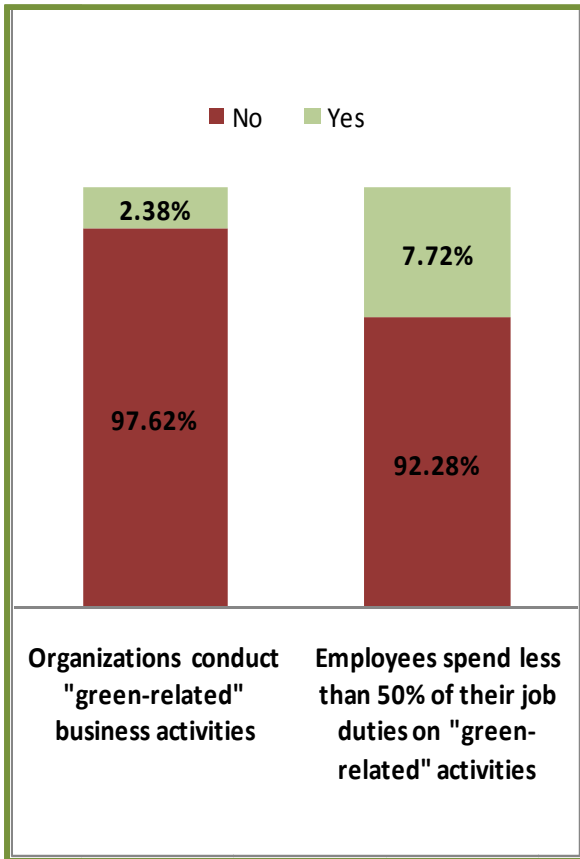


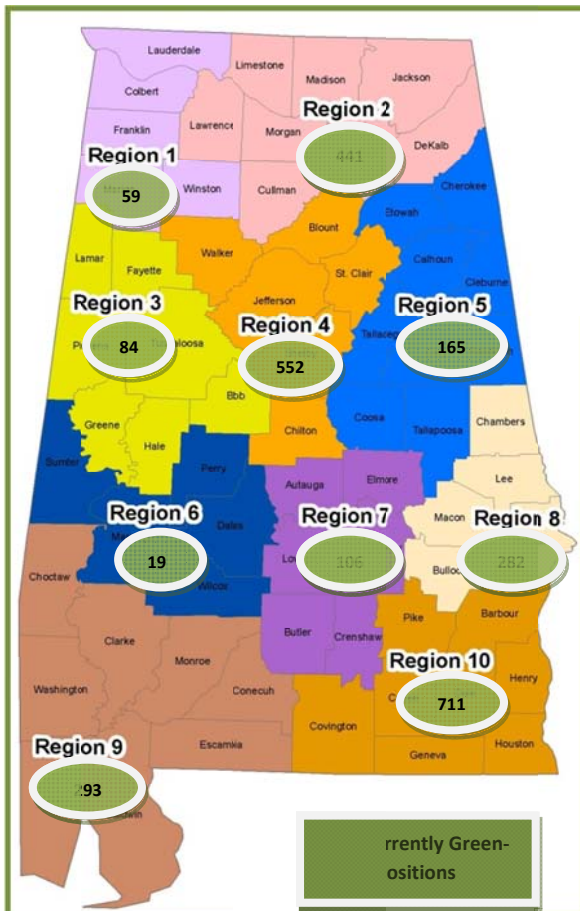
Alabama Statewide Green Jobs Survey Snapshot

Green Survey Summary



- The State of Alabama is comprised of sixty-seven counties which are grouped into ten Workforce Development Regions (WDRs). In 2008, Alabama is pleased to have employed over 2.2 million workers in the state.
- 10,562 employers responded to the survey.
- About 2.4 percent of these employers reported that their organizations conduct green-related business activities.
- A little over 7.7 percent of respondents stated that their employees spend less than 50 percent of their time performing green-related job duties.
- Of the organizations that responded to the survey, approximately 30.0 percent (625 organizations) reported employees in currently green-filled jobs.

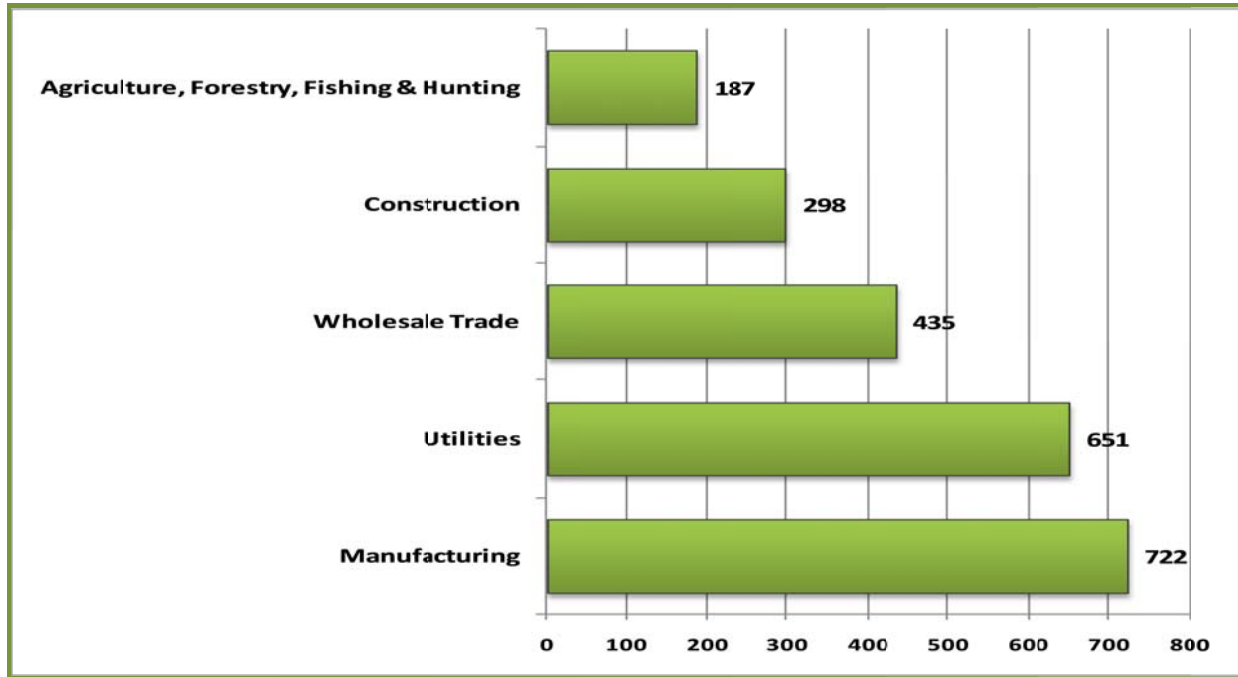
Currently Green-Filled Positions by Workforce Development Regions



- 2,844 total jobs were reported as currently green-filled job positions within the state of Alabama.
- Region 10 reported the highest percentage of currently green-filled jobs at 25.0 percent (711 jobs) of the survey sample.
- 6.05 percent of the organizations that completed the survey stated that they would like to receive more information about incorporating green initiatives in to their business plan.

Alabama Statewide Top 5 Industry Sectors by Green-Filled Jobs

The top five industries with the highest count of currently green-filled positions are illustrated on the chart below. 14 of the 44 industries selected to be included in the green survey had job positions that were currently filled with green jobs as reported by the survey respondents.



Alabama statewide, Manufacturing, Utilities, Wholesale Trade and Construction industries are reported as the top industry sectors with 74.1 percent of the currently green-filled jobs based on the green survey results.

Green-Related Certifications/Training

From the number of organizations (626 survey respondents) that responded that they have some type of green business activity, 46 organizations stated that their businesses and/or employees had some aspect of specialized green-related certifications and/or trainings. Types of certification and/or training reported included but not limited to LEED certifications; Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) certification; ISO14001 Environmental Management standards; and, Water Sense, Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Partnership program.

Of the 2,844 currently green-filled positions, 12.3 percent (351 positions) of the currently green-filled positions had green-related certification and/or training.

Of the 57 green job vacancies reported, 68.0 percent of these job vacancies would require green-related certification and/or training.
